

Western Journal of Black Studies Style Guidelines

Title Page:

Include only the title of paper and name of author(s).

Second Title Page:

Type the title of the paper, author(s) information, which includes present position, complete address, telephone number, and an acknowledgement of financial or technical assistance.

Abstract:

Type the title of the paper (without author's name) and brief abstract of 100–125 words substantively summarizing the article. The abstract should be typed single space and should be informative, giving the reader a “taste” of the article.

Body:

Format

Your paper should be typed double space and should be no more than 30 pages in length, including bibliography, tables, etc. Clearly indicate the point or position in which you would like a table or figure to appear, as shown in the example below:

Tables and Figures:

Attach figures and tables, numbered consecutively. Be sure to place each on a separate page. It is preferred that authors create tables and figures using Microsoft Excel, but if unfamiliar with Excel, the use of a Microsoft Word table is acceptable.
